# Couple Shares Regal Lily Hobby

Our visit this week with The Eccentric photographer takes us to the home of W. A. P. John of Tooting Lane. He is well known in the field of advertising and during his retirement of cycle life has kept very busy with worthwhile civic programs, a good example for those gentlemen who are entering retirement.

He was on the list of the Michigan Horticultural society as a gardener who through the years has been interested in plant selection and a study of their optimum needs.

Lilies are a current interest and the Johns particularly like regal lilies for cutting which accounts for having more than 50 bulbs of this variety in production.

In the travels of the Johns they have collected rare and beautiful madonnas so that it is obvious why Mrs. John might enjoy making arrangements of regal lilies with their white splendor to complement her hobby.

Their flower garden has been cut down in size over a span of years due to labor hour requirements necessary to keep a large area up to prime condition.

The John home has an interesting plant room 12 feet by 18 feet with conditioned humidity and light for hobby growing of plants during the winter months. Their

current interest is in cyclamen as a noted plant for the best results with their growing conditions.

In the past year writer has proclaimed the cyclamen as being the best flowering plant for use in your homes. You can be assured of at least two or three months of constant flowering from one plant. It is difficult to "hold over" so it is best to discard it at the end of its flowering tribute.

IT IS ALWAYS a pleasure to share the garden interest of Mr. John and the tie up of the design and flowering material with Mrs. John's artistic expression.

In our community we have an eager flower arranging group and they might appreciate directions for waxing flowers which can be used for floating in an arrangement or punch bowl.

**SELECT LARGE** petaled flowers which do not complex details in form and be sure they are not in full bloom. Rinse in cold water and drain on a towel in the refrigerator.

Melt two or three pounds of paraffin in the top of a double boiler. Allow it to cool after melting until the wax is lukewarm. Skim off the scum and save to re-melt at a future date.

Hold the flower by the stem and with a downward movement dip the flower and swish it around, shake it a little to remove excess wax and turn it upright. Hold it a minute for the wax to set and now immerse in cool water. Place it in the refrigerator to set and store it there, removing it when it is to be used. Be sure and not freeze your masterpiece.

AT THIS DATE I hope you have your fertilizer in the garage all ready for the fall feeding. I assume you have lifted your iris which have become large clumps and have divided your choice stock with an appreciative neighbor or that cute young couple who are aspiring to have their new home look like the best in their block.

It is important that you get your seed in right away so the grass can get a good start before the leaves fall. The fall is the best time to start a lawn. Cheap mixtures of seed are not a bargain. The cost per pound is important, if you are buying it for the birds.

THE SEED of natural blue-grass runs approximately 2 million seeds to the pound while rye seed only has the one quarter million seeds per pound. The blue grass will give approximately eight times more coverage. Two pounds per thousand square feet are generally sufficient in a cart if it is a good suggestion for you to use vermiculite mixed with the seed to assure coverage so the seeds will expose at the right rate and you can tell where you have been by the tell-tale tracing of the vermiculite.
