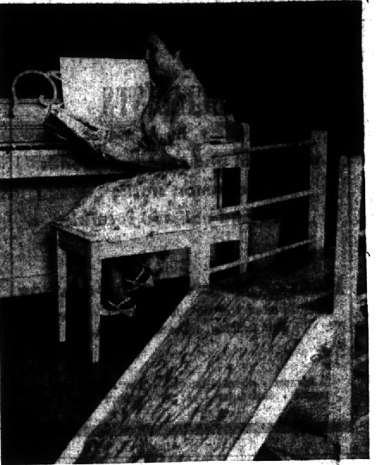
The nursery school is set up by the Methodist church as a supplement to the work of the home in

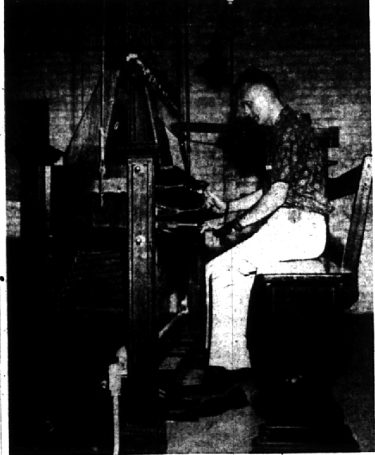
