**Alcohol Rehab Hospital
Founded in Hills in '52**

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the sixth in a series of articles in which Carl H. Zwinck, Seaboard high school science instructor, reports his findings on problems involving beverage alcohol. He is a member of the Michigan committee on alcohol education. He is recently returned from the Yale summer school of alcohol studies.

Harry Henderson, Detroit businessman, was a member and later chairman, of the State Liquor Control commission from 1947 to 1953. He made three major contributions to the state during that period. He introduced bills which established the State Board of Alcoholism and which required alcohol education in Michigan schools. These two legislative acts have already had far-reaching effects.

HENDERSON found that there was a major need for a hospital for the medical care and rehabilitation of alcoholics. This led to his "Little Brown Jug" campaign. \$22,000 was raised by placing small

became medical director of the Brighton Hospital for Alcoholism, which had been moved from Woodward to a new home five miles southeast of Brighton, on Grand River, old U.S. 16.

DR. GREEN integrated medical therapy with the Alcoholics Anonymous program. He presented a series of 11 a.m. lectures held every week during the year. In March 1953 he retired, but his program is continuing in the 42-bed hospital, rolling countryside and 89 acres of modern additions house both men and women patients. Harry Henderson is still president of the non-profit Brighton Hospital foundation and personally gives some of the 11 a.m. lectures.

He planned the new wings and has designed a chapel which will be a new building near the old house. Currently he is working on plans for occupational therapy and new facilities for laboratories and offices.

THE MINIMUM hospitalization period is seven days. Fourteen days are required for most of the patients stay much longer. Michigan Blue Cross and a number of hospitals for occupational therapy and new facilities for laboratories and offices.

Patients have come from the Birmingham area, all parts of the Michigan, nearby states and Ontario. More than 5,000 patients have been treated. Most of these patients return to their jobs and a useful life in community life.

Medical treatment, 24-hour nursing service, good food, fresh air and exercise are provided for all patients. They may fish in a private lake on the hospital grounds, and a golf course is to be built.

THERAPY includes the 11 a.m. lectures which are based on these seven basic topics:
1) Alcoholism as a disease; the alcoholic pattern;
2) Alcohol as an anesthetic;
3) Physiological effects of alcohol on the human system;
4) Treatment of alcoholism;
5) Recovery and rehabilitation;
6) Alcoholics Anonymous in action.

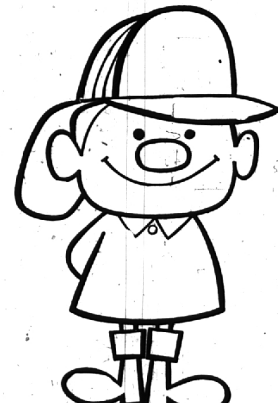

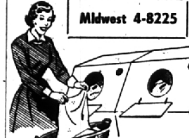
