Ask S'field Mail Service Be City-wide

SOUTHFIELD—A most office that will serve the entire city, rather than just certain portions is being banked for Southfield by Congressman William S. Broomfield.

In a letter to the Chicago regional operations director of the post office department, Broomfield said, "It had been my understanding that all the area in Southfield would be served by the new post office, and it came as quite a surprise to learn that sizable commercial and industrial sections are contemplated for exclusion."

Legal Snag Stalls School Water Mains
SOUTHFIELD—A Southfield city land developer's attorney told the council last week that the city cannot special assess for water mains.

The decision, written by Harold Hooper, Rodney Lockwood's attorney, temporarily stalled plans for getting water mains into the new Evergreen elementary-junior high school at 11 Mile road.

The opinion could affect the city's entire water expansion program.
