Lockwood claimed that the three projects had been placed in one special assessment district and that the assessments should have been spread to three districts.

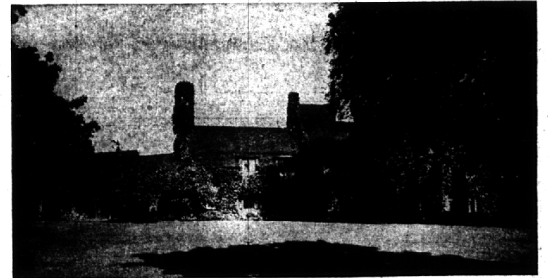
