On Good Friday, April 15, services will be held at 1 p.m. and 8:15 p.m. There will be a series of sev-

EASTER CELEBRATIONS will be held April 17, beginning with a sunrise service in the chapel at 5:45 a.m. The message will be delivered by Rev. At the festival service at 10:30 a.m., Rev. A. Karl Boehmke will preach on the theme, "Why Weep on Easter?" The church choir under Mrs. Goodell will sing "All in the Morning" by Maryott.

St. Columban Pledges Total \$112,000

The active phase of the St. Columban school and convent enlargement campaign concluded recently with a pledge total of \$112,000.

The campaign now enters the continuation and follow-up phase under the guidance of John A. McCarthy and associates, Detroit Catholic financial analysts, who conducted the campaign.

THE CAMPAIGN WAS announced to the parishioners on Feb. 7 by the Rev. Thomas M. Kenny, Pastor. At the time 120 volunteer workers were recruited and trained in campaign procedures.

The initial phase of the campaign was the memorial gift program under the director of Wilfred Sain. The general chairman was Don Richards and his associate was Andrew Jardine.

The campaign was conducted to help raise sufficient funds to construct four additional classrooms and to enlarge the convent facilities.

THE CONTINUATION chairman with their committee members will function over the 24-month pledge payment period. The visitation chairman is William McGee and the audit chairman is Patrick Russell. Their main duties will be to direct the volunteers to help raise the present pledge total and help convert the pledges into cash.

The chancel choir, directed by Albert Bolitho, will present the cantata, "The Seven Last Words," composed by Theodore Dubois.

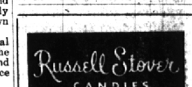
Christ Church Sets Holy Week Services

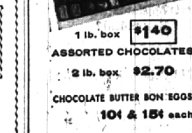
