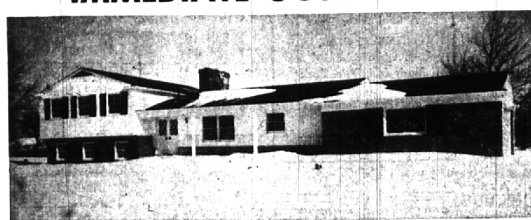

The other tribe is the Dakota tribe with Bud Rankin as the chief. There are 10 boys in the tribe meeting every other Monday night.

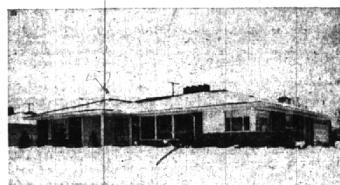

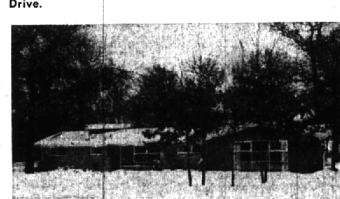

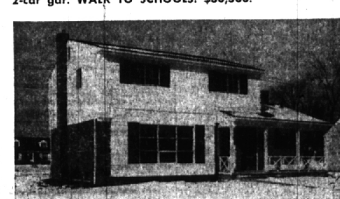
