

SAD Hearing Prompts Questions, Objections

BEVERLY HILLS—About 75 residents left standing room only as they jammed the Beverly Hills village hall for the initial public hearing on the village's first big special assessment district. They had many questions, but few objections to the huge sewer lateral project, slated to cost \$25,475, plus \$143,000 for the mains and pumping stations.

Biggest objection to the project, slated to connect the entire western half of the village to the Evergreen interceptor sewer, came from residents along the west side of Lahar road.

Many of them owners of homes on large lots where septic tanks work satisfactorily, they protested the expense resulting from inclusion in the project. They were assured by Village President Marvin E. Cline that the possibility of their exclusion from the project would be explored.

PRESENT plans call for a lateral run down Lahar road, to which the homes involved would be connected. Residents were told by Dr. Douglas A. Wood that they would have six months after completion of the lateral to hook in to them, if health authorities deemed it necessary. Albert Gattward, 31820 Belknap, assured the council that many residents did not attend the hearing because they

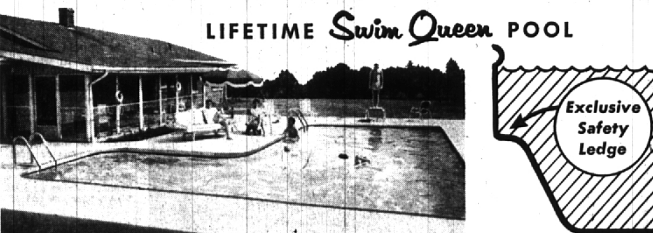

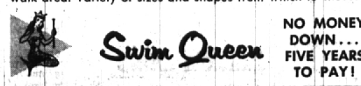
