Pool Foes, Supporters Jam Meet

More than 100 persons jammed the Troy commission room Monday night when the commission again postponed action on an ordinance regulating swimming pools until the city attorney can rewrite the ordinance.

Under consideration for the ordinance are regulations regarding size of parking area, proximity of pool to major thoroughfares, consent of surrounding property owners and residence requirements for members.

Troyton Manor swim club President Charles Hooker, 1095 Brooklawn, asked commissioners to consider advantages as well as disadvantages of a community pool before finalizing the measure. His group seeks permission for a pool near Big Beaver and Adams.

ROBERT MCKIBBEN, 1227 Westwood, spokesman for Troy residents opposing the pool, said his group would reserve comment for an official public hearing, to be held when the ordinance is complete.

A date for the public hearing has not been set.

Charges Yanich Holds Troy Seat Contrary to Law

City Commission Now Functionless — Or Is It?

TROY—An era ended—more or less—this week when one of Troy's original city commissioners, also one of Troy's most outspoken city commissioners, George T. (Ted) Yeokum stepped down and turned over his seat to Roy J. Duncan, winner in last week's election.

His retirement means the loss of a leader for the opposition to Mayor Robert J. Huber's faction.

YEOKUM will devote his time to the Yeokum Brothers hardware store at Maple and John R. (His brother, William, however, is no longer part of the firm).

His plans do not include his running for mayor, he said.

Commission Names Foe Of Huber

One of Troy, Mayor Robert J. Huber's most persistent critics was appointed Monday night to replace him on the county board of supervisors. Mrs. Joseph R. Schmansky, Jr., 6213 Malvern, was named by the commission's majority to represent Troy on the 82-man county board.

The housewife and mother of two children supported Commissioners Roy L. Duncan and Clifford F. Sutermister in their election fight for return this month to their commission seats. The pair, along with three other commissioners, supported the move to appoint Mrs. Schmansky. The vote was 5-2, with Huber voting yes.

At the same time another 5-2 vote reappointed Duncan and Commissioner Fred W. Hildebrand as Commissioners.

Discord between the commission

old guard and Huber-led newcomers has been apparent for months. Supporting Huber in his move to be reappointed as a supervisor were Wallace B. Hudson and Vincent J. McAvoy.

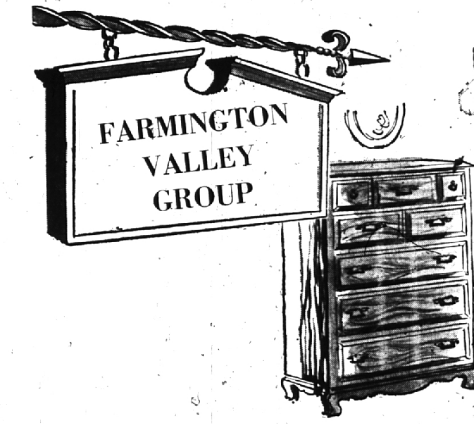

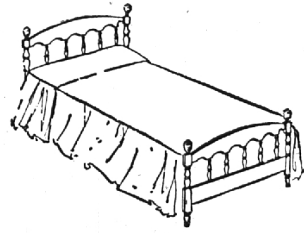
