Cranbr'k Women Plan Annual Rummage Sale

Everything from fur coats to electric stoves will be on sale April 26 at the annual spring rummage sale sponsored by the Episcopal Churchwomen of Christ Church Cranbrook.

The sale hours are from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The money received from the sale finances the social service projects and activities of the group. Services include sewing, knitting, making cancer pads for the Red Cross and working in conjunction with social service agencies to supply needs for low income families.

The group also gives hours to volunteer work in hospitals, homes for the aged and other places of confinement where craft classes are organized and magazines, records and playing cards are distributed.

MORE THAN 200 women have worked on the rummage sale. Some 1,500 are expected to hunt for treasures at the sale.
