

Solemn Procession Begins Adoration

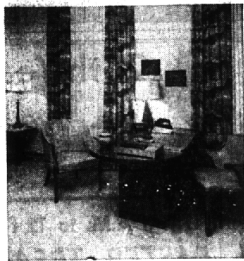
Holy Name church will have a solemn high procession at 7:30 tonight in observance of Holy Thursday. A low mass is scheduled at 8:30 p.m.

Kirk in The Hills Slates Special Lent Services

Tonight at 8, Maundy Thursday will be observed with a special holy communion service in remembrance of the Last Supper.

On Good Friday, a service commemorating the Crucifixion will be held at the Kirk at 1 p.m., with Dr. DeWint preaching.

THREE FESTIVAL Easter services will be held at the Kirk at 7:30, 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. The chancel choir will sing the traditional music of Easterday at all three services.

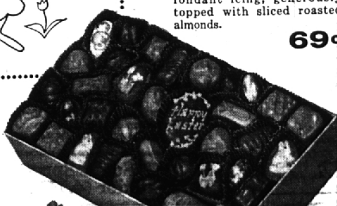
