Fire Damages Home in Southfield

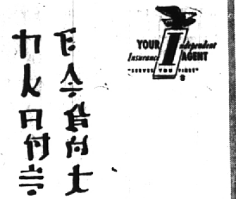

Life Saving Class Planned for Moms

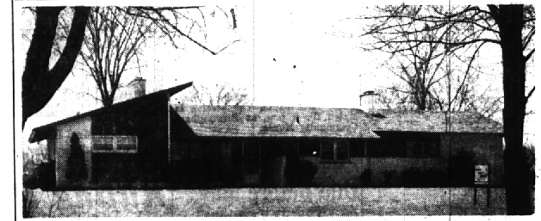

Lathrup Physician To Head College

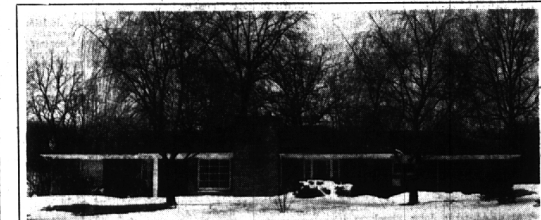
