

Clarkson Reports South Oakland Child Clinic OK

LANSING — State Rep. S. James Clarkson, (D), 4th district, reported Tuesday that the House of Representatives has approved a 1960 mental health appropriation bill which authorizes establishment of a South Oakland child guidance clinic.

The Senate has already approved the \$25,000 appropriation for the new clinic.

"Without Oakland county's continuous support for this clinic, there would have been little chance for obtaining state participation in this year's austerity budget," Clarkson said.

Weather Helps Roads Improve Throughout Area

Roads improved this week in the Birmingham area, mostly because of help from the weatherman.

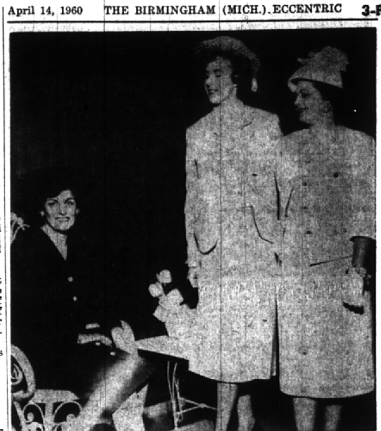

Mrs. Phelps, whose husband is an engineer at the Technical Center, will be in charge of the ladies for the day's activities.



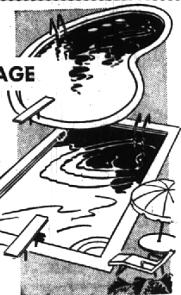
'For Tulip Time'

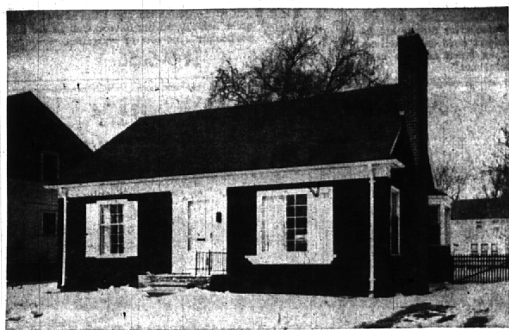
