S'field, Township To Continue Case On Election Costs

SOUTHFIELD TOWNSHIP—Southfield city and Southfield township agreed this week to continue in the defense of a \$26,000 special election expense case brought against them by Oakland county.

Circuit Court Judge William John Beer recommended the township and the city consider paying half of the costs incurred in two such a successful incorporation attempt.

The city voted Monday to continue its fight; the township did the same Tuesday.

THE CASE WHICH was adjourned Monday for two weeks was filed in September, 1958. State law says the "locality" must pay. Point in question is which is the "locality," the county or the city and/or township.

Judge Beer suggested the city's share in a settlement would be \$3,000 and the township's \$2,700. Total of the two plus costs would be approximately half the expenses involved.
