

## 8-Mile Drain Stall Causes Detroit Threat

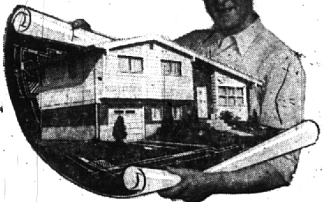

**THE COUNCIL** did not make its approval subject to the requirement.

Councilmen agreed on a ten-year financing plan for the \$200 tab-in fee to be charged lot owners connecting with the Evergreen interceptor sewer.

The plan calls for annual payments, plus six per cent interest, to be added to village tax bills. First year's payment would be \$41.60, with the amount decreasing annually until the amount is paid.

**PLANS ARE** to assess the charges against the 107 homes in the Acacia drain system when their present sewers are connected to the Evergreen interceptor this year.

sented sticker candidates Anderson and Van Meer, who petitioned for the recount.

Lawrence Carroll and Ray Davis of the Michigan election commission observed the recount, as did Mrs. Mabel Child of the Oakland county election commission.

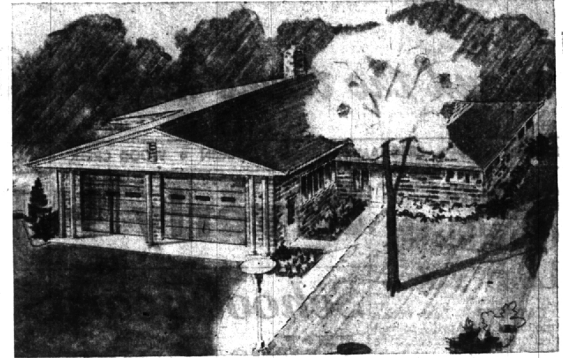
**IN THE** final tally of votes, Anderson lost 14 sticker votes because they were placed in slots other than the 1, 2 or 3 positions at the machines. He lost 10 votes because they were placed with others in a single slot, for a total of 23 votes. Karl took 14 and a total of 23. Van Meer had 35 and 10 votes disqualified, for a total of 45.

The board of canvassers discarded the votes because it was possible to vote for more than three candidates in write-in or stickers were not placed in the proper slots.

Hays told the board that a voter could push up a slot for a sticker candidate but still vote for two regular candidates by lever, and by placing stickers in any position beyond the first sticker slot, add three more votes.

**AT THE** close of the recount, sticker candidate Anderson said, "This puts an end to all the rumors that have been drifting around the city about great numbers of discarded votes."

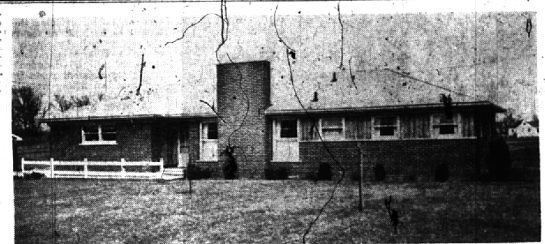

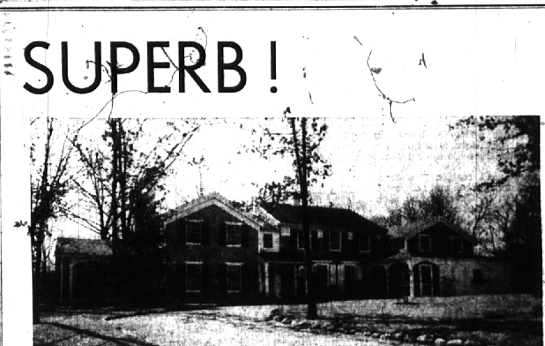
