Visiting Nurse says "That the association provides multiple functions, nursing, physical, occupational, diet, therapy and home aide services." Treatments are given only by medical prescription. The public health nurse members of the staff carry the responsibility of planning with the physician and family when patients need several types of services, whether they are provided by this agency or others.

THEY ALSO supervise the work of the Association's practical nurses and home aides. Home aides are assigned to families of patients selected because they need personal and housekeeping services in order to keep the family together.

The chairman of the committee, Mrs. Merle A. Welch will introduce Dr. Clair Gates who is the public health consultant for the united community services of Metropolitan Detroit.

HE WILL SPEAK on "Health Problems in our area and what we, as citizens, can do." Dr. Gates graduated from the University of Michigan medical school in 1937. He has held several Public Health positions in Minneapolis, Minn., before coming to Detroit.
