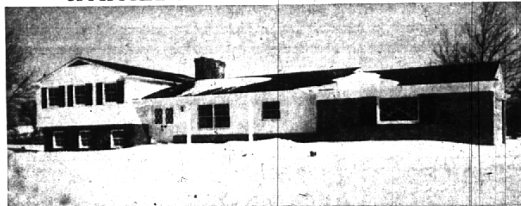

Robert Hampson Named Chairman Of Franklin Planners

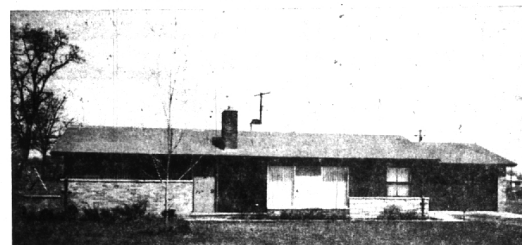
FRANKLIN—Robert Hampson was named new chairman of the village planning commission Monday.
