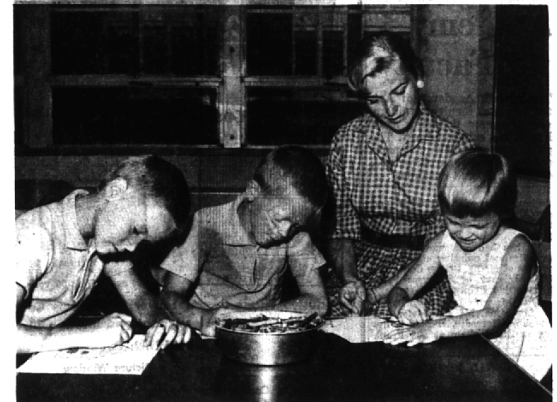

**Baptists Break Ground For Education Building**

The First Baptist church of Birmingham will break ground Sunday, Aug. 7 for the new educational building.

The ceremony will be at 10:45 a.m. on the lawn to the west of the church office. There will be no church school session and the congregation will leave the sanctuary at the close of the 9:30 worship service.

Representatives from the church organizations will also be present.

CONSTRUCTION for the new building will begin shortly after Aug. 7. It will be completed early in 1961. Cost of the structure, equipment and minor alterations in the present building will be an estimated \$275,000.
