**Purchase of Four Trucks Authorized By City Commission**

Bids for the replacement of four trucks in the city equipment pool were accepted by the Birmingham city commission Monday night.

On the recommendation of DPW Supt. T. C. Brien, the commission awarded contracts to: Harold Turner, Inc. for a dump truck in the sewer and water division at \$8,071.18; Stark Hickey Ford, Inc. for a dump truck in the forestry department at \$8,118 and a DPW dump truck at \$5,207.

GMC TRUCK and Coach for a winch truck for the forestry department at \$3,449.80.

The city commission approved of \$1,225 for construction by DPW mechanics of a truck-bed and boom to make a workable unit of the winch truck. The unit being purchased consists only of a truck chassis and a winch at the rear of the cab.

**Drain Levy Set**

The 1960 levy for the drain-at-large was set at one-half mill by the Birmingham city commission Monday night. It is expected to produce an additional \$33,505.63 for the drain fund. Determination of the levy was made at this time so it could be included on the tax warrant issued by the board of supervisors for the winter tax roll.

Sealed bids for the purchase of 1960 Special Assessment Sanitary Sewer Bonds will be received by the undersigned at his office in the City Hall in the City of Troy, State of Michigan, until 7:00 o'clock p. m., Eastern Standard Time, on Monday, the 12th day of August, 1960, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said 1960 Special Assessment Sanitary Sewer Bonds will be coupon bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, numbered consecutively in direct order of maturity from 1 to 41, inclusive, and dated July 1, 1960, and will mature serially as follows:

\$11,000.00 July 1, 1961;  
\$11,000.00 July 1, 1962;  
\$11,000.00 July 1, 1963;  
\$11,000.00 July 1, 1964.

Interest on said bonds will be payable on July 1, 1961, and semi-annually thereafter on January 1st and July 1st of each year.

Said bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five per cent (5%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/4 of 1%. The interest for each coupon period on any one bond shall be at one rate only and represented by one interest coupon. Both principal and interest will be payable at the option of the issuer to be designated by the purchaser of the bonds. Accrued interest to the date of delivery of such bonds must be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

Bonds numbered 1 to 41, inclusive, maturing on or before July 1, 1961, shall not be subject to redemption prior to maturity.

Bonds numbered 42 to 56, inclusive, maturing in the year 1961, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the issuer in inverse numerical order, on any interest payment date on or after July 1, 1961, at a serial accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

"Thirty days' notice of the call of any bonds for redemption shall be given by publication in a paper circulated in the State of Michigan, which is called for of its regular service, notice of sale of municipal bonds." (Michigan Compiled Statutes, Section 207.10.)

Interest on said bonds will be payable on July 1, 1961, and semi-annually thereafter on January 1st and July 1st of each year.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from September 1, 1960, to their maturity. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the City. No proposal for the purchase of the City of Troy bonds for a value of less than all of the bonds herein offered, or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

Said bonds may be issued in anticipation of the collection of one assessment on the bonds in Special Assessment District No. 24. In addition, said bonds will be subject to the full faith and credit of the City of Troy for their payment.

A certified or cashier's check in an amount of \$11,000.00, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the undersigned, the City of Troy, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks, and checks of unsuccessful bidders will promptly be returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Miller, Canfield, Packard and Stone, attorneys of Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof. The City shall pay the cost of printing the bonds. Bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan.
