## Pvt. Tim Wheeler Qualifies 'Expert' At Post in Germany

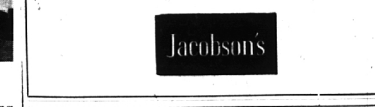

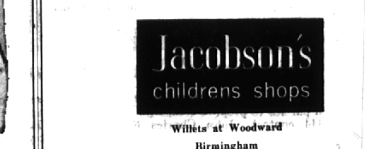

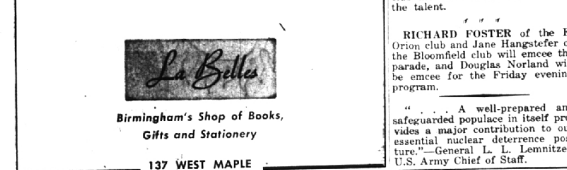
