### Michigan's 1st Heliport In S'field

SOUTHFIELD—Last week that it will operate a heliport facility at Northland shopping center for Southfield business officials and private passengers. It is the first in Michigan providing commuter service.

### Swanson Vetoes Council's Firing Of Administrator

SOUTHFIELD—Mayor Donald L. Swanson of Southfield last week vetoed the city council's firing of City Administrator Robert J. McNutt and issued a caustic statement to the city clerk.

McNutt was fired by a 4-2 vote of the council July 26.

In his statement, Swanson blamed "the individual legislator's personal feelings" for the firing that created "a chaotic condition" in the city.

SWANSON LASHED at John J. Hollywood, C. Hugh Dohany, O. David Edwards and Thomas M. Costello for the action.

He called the council meeting agendas "a farce" and the city budget a "mockery."

Swanson also squared off against Hollywood who called for the firing of McNutt. "It was primarily through glowing reports (from Hollywood) of Mr. McNutt's tremendous ability that Mr. Dohany any myself made the recommendation to the council that Mr. McNutt be hired. Perhaps Mr. Hollywood, based on his present attitudes, would concede an error of judgment," Swanson stated.

"I AM CERTAIN, however," Swanson continued, "that any man or woman who works for a living which this council chose to 'fire' Mr. McNutt. If one employee can be treated in this manner, then no one within the 'jurisdiction' of the council is safe from its wrath."

### Burglars Take \$15 From Lumber Firm

SOUTHFIELD—Burglars broke into a Southfield lumber company late Saturday and escaped with \$15.

Officials of Lawrence Lumber Company, 29085 Greenfield, Southfield, told police the thieves broke open the back door with an ax.

According to the Southfield police, it is approximately the fourth time that Lawrence Lumber has been broken into this year.
