This year the Lions, desperately needing offensive linemen, again looked to the Irish and tapped 250-pound center Bob Scholtz on the list. After the annual draft, it begins to look as if "lightning has struck twice" as the husky Notre Dame pivotman has impressed Lion coaches with his work from the opening whistle.

AS IN THE CASE OF Pietrosante, there were some dissenters in the ranks when the Lions went for Scholtz. Their ideas went something like this: "This strong on offense" . . . or, "lack of necessary agility to do the job at the pros" . . . or, "weak on pass blocking."

You can throw out all these reports as of now and take the word of Lions' line coach Aldo Forte that the strapping Irish center has all it takes to become a top-notch pro performer at center.

"In the brief time that Scholtz has been in camp," explains Forte, "he has done everything that I was have asked of him. I'll admit I was a bit concerned about those early scout reports but they must have been looking at someone else. Bob has shown us as a lot and I predict he'll play a lot of football for us this fall."

ERRONEOUS scouting reports are nothing new in football. There were many so-called experts who predicted that Don Walker "didn't have it for pro football" and some of these same scouts insisted that Pietrosante was "too slow" for the play-for-pay ranks.
