Right of Way Violations Lead Accident Causes

A total of 56 accidents were recorded during July by the Birmingham police department. Some 20 of them were property damage and 16 personal injury accidents.

According to a report from Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley, "right of way" violations again led the list of causative factors. "Improper overtaking" was second and "following too closely" was third.

In the first six months of this year, traffic accidents increased to 441 from 410 during the same period last year. Personal injury accidents increased from 97 last year to 160 this year. Personal injuries showed an increase from 88 last year to 109 this year.

SOME OF THE increase can be attributed to more complete reporting as covered in the new accident report form, Chief Moxley stated, however, there is a substantial trend upward in the accident picture this year as compared to the same period last year. No fatalities were recorded in June or July.

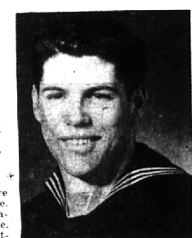
