the village because of extended services, and apartment dwellers who "might not be concerned with the community" made the proposal undesirable.

Enthusiastic cheering accompanied Poland's presentation of a thick sheet of protesting petitions bearing 1,232 signatures. A representative of Cranbrook village subdivision #2, across 13 Mile in Southfield, added that residents

there unanimously opposed the rezoning. Mountain built his case on the premise that land zoning's purpose is to "promote public health, safety and welfare." He claimed the multiple dwellings would not adversely affect "health, safety and welfare" and said he believed property values would go up if the apartments were built. Cline told him, "It behooves you to tell us why this is unreasonable zoning. Have you attempted to develop this land for single family residential?"

AS THE session ended, one councilman wondered aloud "what sort of a petition will be re-submitted since we've denied this request."

Asked whether the three investors would submit a new proposal for the property, Keating said Tuesday that he wasn't too sure.

"I wouldn't build single family homes on that land," he said. He said he and Cleary were considering selling their interests to O'Neill, leaving him free "to sell to anybody he wants."

He said he believed the only solution was to wait for further changes in development, such as the proposed building of an elementary school at one corner of the intersection and the eventual widening of 13 Mile.

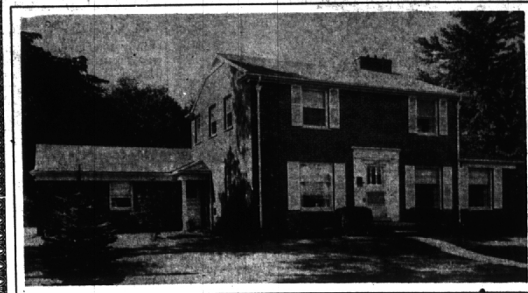

FRANKLIN—The Franklin Community association has been granted a two-week postponement to prepare its defense against the temporary injunction holding up building of a new community hall, officers of the group Aug. 2 and a show cause hearing set for Aug. 16 before the Oakland county court. However, stating there was not ample time allowed to prepare a proper brief, association attorney Orland Ellis gained the postponement.

The Property Owners Protective Association, Inc., has taken the matter to court in an effort to make the injunction permanent. The action was taken after the community association filed application for a building permit on Aug. 1.

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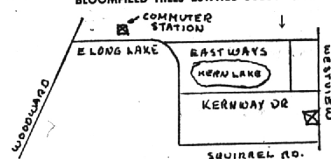
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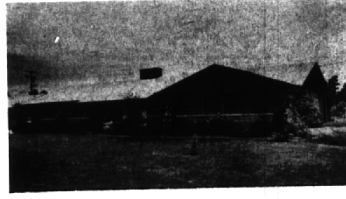
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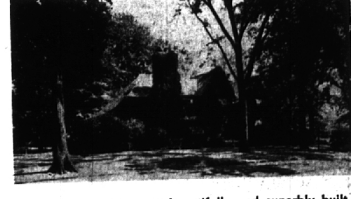
