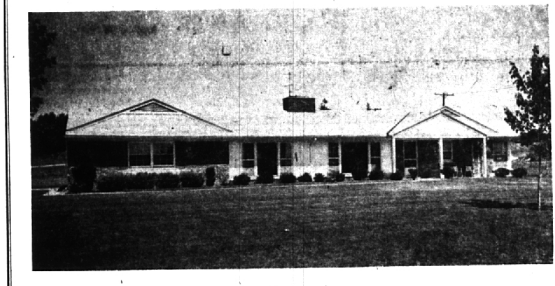

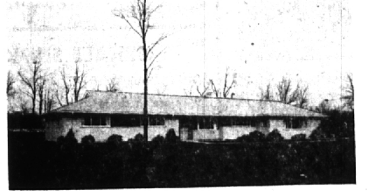

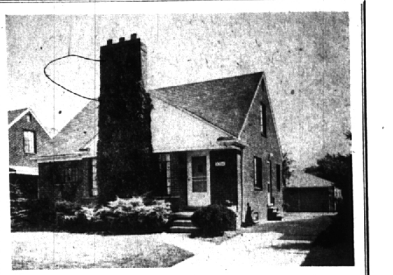
Road Resurfacing Program To Start

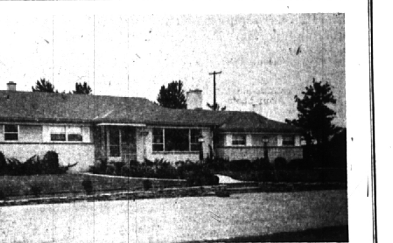
