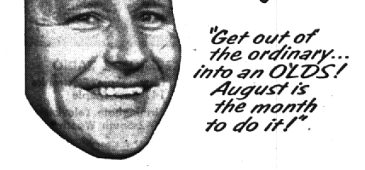

Former Resident Named to Top Post

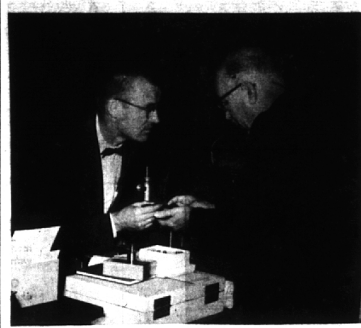

Local Researcher Finds Relief in Flower Hobby

Producers of a recent television commercial that conferred the title "thinking" upon a man who enjoyed brick-laying as an antidote for accounting, might have found another proper subject in the maple shaded rock garden at 1088 Oxford drive, Birmingham. The owner and caretaker of this garden is Colonel Leslie S. Fletcher.

The colonel finds tulips, roses, and peonies a welcome relief from such subjects as "recent investigations into the blanking and piercing of sheet materials" or "determination of loading a Henry and Wright dieing machine at various speeds and with different types of punch arid on lamination die." A graduate of West Point and Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Fletcher is director of the Research Fund of the American Society of Tool and Manufacturing Engineers, whose national headquarters are in Detroit.

THE RESEARCH FUND is an independent, non-profit corporation dedicated to applied basic research in the tool and manufacturing engineering field. Colonel Fletcher directs a variety of research programs placed under contract to universities, research laboratories and libraries.

The selection of projects to be undertaken is made by Fletcher and committees of authorities in the particular areas, who are selected from industry, universities, I.P.'s, and diesel powered industrial vehicles.

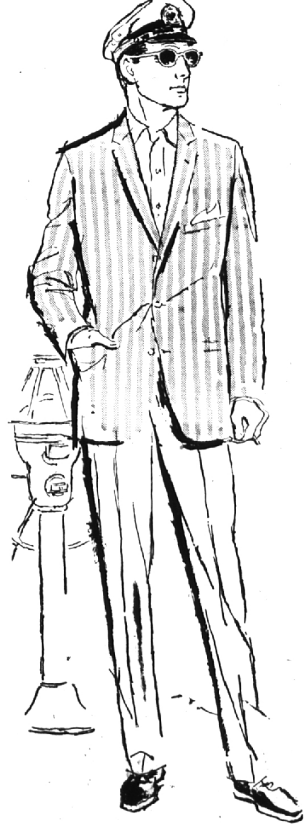
Holland comes to Oakite after thirteen years with Ford Motor company, where he was production engineer, and four years with General Motors.
