'Modes for Milady'

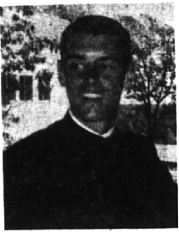

John Dowd Received Into Society of Jesus

John Dowd, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edwin P. Dowd of 588 Larchlea, Birmingham, was received Monday into the Society of Jesus, a religious order of the Roman Catholic church.

Pronouncing his perpetual vows of poverty, chastity and obedience at Columbiere college, Dowd became affiliated with the largest single body of male religious in the Catholic church.

An alumnus of the University of Detroit High school, Dowd, 21, has now completed a two-year trial program. For the next two years, he will study the humanities at Columbiere and then transfer to West Baden college, Ind., for philosophical studies. He will then

teach in one of the Detroit province high schools.

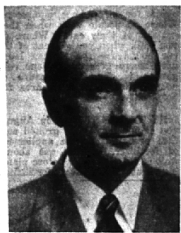
