HOWEVER, Rehard added that township attorney Floyd Blakejee feels that existence of a separate building contract between the DFW and Farmington interceptor system can still be a possible means

of separating Farmington's fate from that of Evergreen. Meanwhile, West Bloomfield is going ahead with building of sewer laterals to the non-functioning Farmington interceptor. The township board last week accepted construction bids for laterals in West Bloomfield Hills subdivision and Westwood Village. Awards will be made after a study. Bids on bonds financing the two projects were received at a special township board meeting last night.

S'field Man Fined \$100

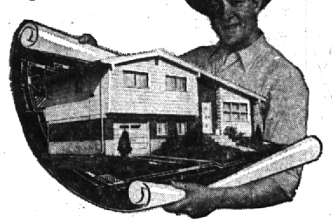

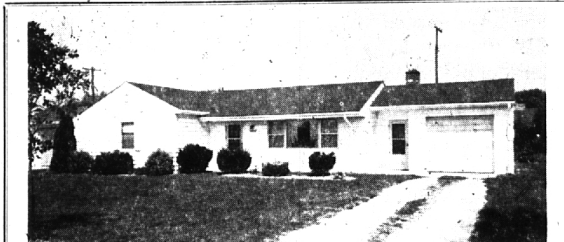

A smorgasbord luncheon is planned. League president is Mrs. Louis Camill and Mrs. James Lanham is the program chairman for the woman's club.

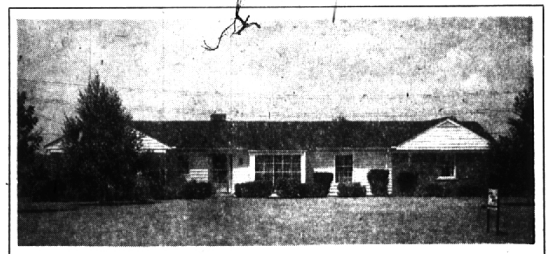
