### Board Authorizes Assessment Costs

SOUTHFIELD—School board members voted Monday to pay the system's share of two special assessment costs, totaling \$145,350, for a sanitary sewer serving the Magnolia school area. Schools are not required by state law to assume such costs. The school administration was authorized by the board to accept the lowest bid for a daily pumping of the sewage tank at Birney school. The school is unable to tie into the Evergreen interceptor due to the tract's refusal to connect local lines with their facilities. Also authorized was the installation of a gas line to the science laboratory at Birney school. The work will be done by the proper system personnel.
