Bank's Dividend Up 55 Cents Per Share

A quarterly dividend of 55 cents a share on the \$10 par value common capital stock (the previous quarterly dividend was 50¢) was declared at a meeting of the board of directors of the Detroit Bank and Trust company last week.

The dividend, payable after the close of business Dec. 30, 1960, to or upon the order of shareholders of record Dec. 9, 1960, represents an increase in the annual rate of dividend from \$2 a share to \$2.20 a share.
