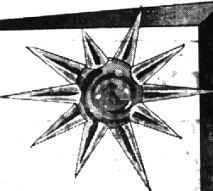


**Have You Met . . .**

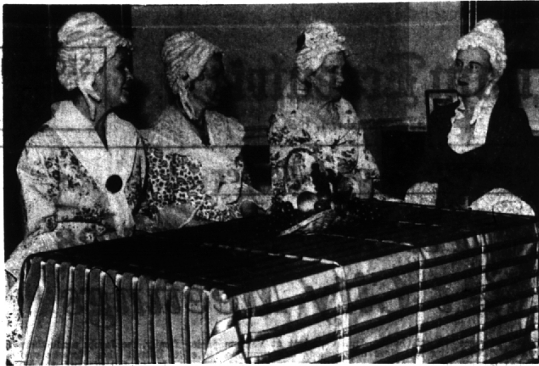
