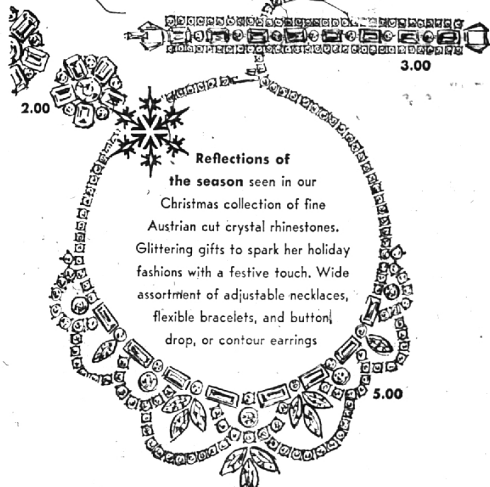
Spiritual Therapy Group Sponsors Christmas Sale

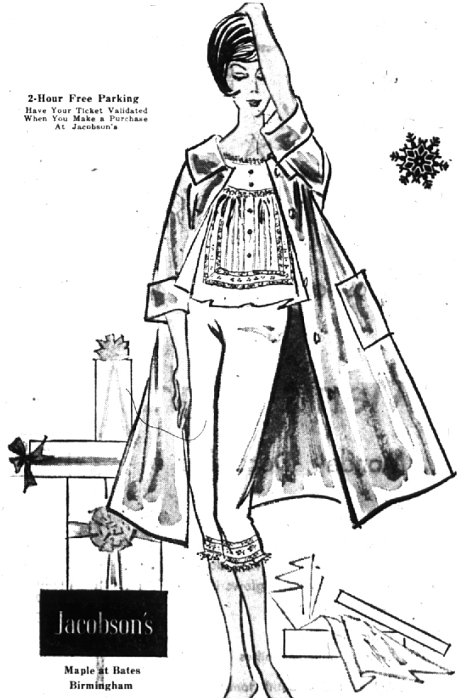

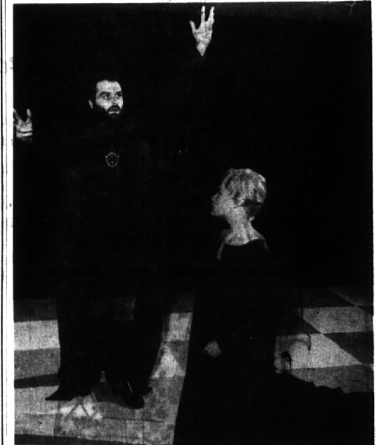
