

Jazz Concert To Benefit Leukemia Fund

The Children's Leukemia foundation of Michigan will present the first annual "Julie Adler Spectacular," a modern jazz dance concert, 8-11 Saturday at the Masonic Temple. The show will feature Paul Lennon, comet of comedy, as master of ceremonies and music by Mickey Woolf.

All proceeds will be given to the Children's Leukemia foundation of Michigan, a volunteer non-profit organization, dedicated to the con-


quering of Leukemia, hemophilia and other serious blood-type diseases. Among the committee members working on this show is James Bradford, 1921 Bradford, Birmingham.

FOR MEDICATION and equipment for several hundred patients, the foundation has given over \$88,000. Medication bills of several hundred dollars in individual cases occur frequently. Approximately 4500 units of blood has been furnished free of charge by the foundation.

Other services include counseling for parents and relatives of the afflicted ones. Then there are Christmas and Halloween parties, summer picnics, candy, toys, gifts and favors.
