The wedding is to take place Feb. 4.



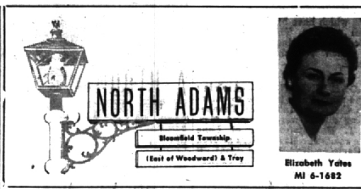

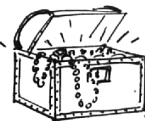
