L. H. Lodge Files Recount Petition With County Clerk

State Sen. L. Harvey Lodge filed a petition Monday for a recount of votes in the race for probate judge in the Nov. 8 election. Lodge lost the post by 694 votes on the basis of complete, canvassed, official returns.

Posting the regulation fee of \$5 each, Lodge asked for a recount in 90 precincts. The petition and fees were posted with County clerk Daniel T. Murphy. His successful opponent for Oakland's new second probate judgeship, Donald Adams, has 48 hours in which to file a counter-petition if he should choose to do so. Lodge said "human error" could account for his losing margin of slightly more than two votes per precinct among the county's 311 precincts.
