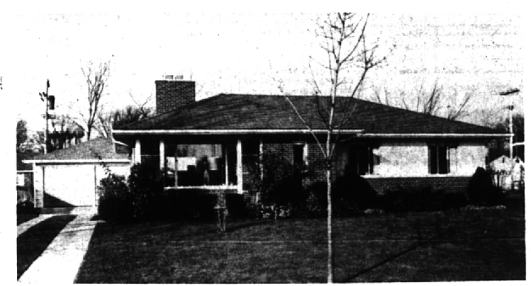

South Berkshires Plans Open House For Old St. Nick

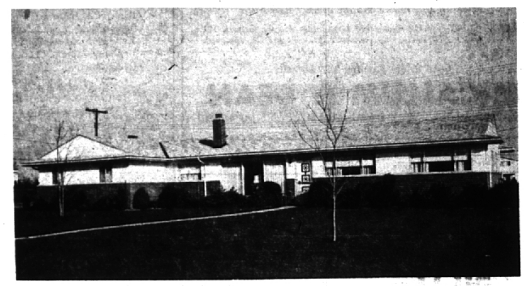
