Highway Info Centers Asked Many Questions

Among the hundreds of thousands of questions answered each year by the Michigan state highway department's four highway information centers are a few hundred "unusual" requests for information.

The Mackinaw city tourist information center easily leads in the number of unusual questions because it is close to the \$100 million Mackinaw bridge.

LAST AUGUST, for instance, a woman rushed into the information center and asked: "Where are all the horse and buggy rides? I just came over the bridge from St. Ignace and I haven't seen a horse, let alone a buggy. I thought there weren't supposed to be any cars on the island, but that's all I've seen since arriving."

SUPERVISOR Robert E. Wallin explained that the Bridge does not line the upper peninsula and Mackinac Island and gave her directions on how to get to the island by boat. Other unusual questions fielded by the Mackinaw city information center include:

—Why did they build such a big beautiful bridge in such a small town as Mackinaw City? Why didn't they build it down near Chicago where more people could admire it?

—Do you mean to tell me there's water all around Mackinac Island? —We just arrived... what is that big bridge up ahead for?

THE MENOMINEE tourist information center has received requests for strange things, but Supervisor Don G. Olson was startled when a woman called asking for a recipe for cheese sauce for appetizers. When Olson told the woman he didn't have such information, she said: "Well, this is an information center, isn't it?" After a fast call to his wife, Olson was able to give the woman the recipe she requested.

OLSON HAD TO call the Menominee county sheriff's department for assistance on another occasion. It seems two middle-aged couples stopped at the center. A few minutes later the men walked out of the building, got in their car and drove off. The sheriff's department found the men about 25 miles north of Menominee, where they had left their wives behind.
