Dental Society Records Life of Dr. Spalding

Dr. Edward Spalding has passed on, but memories of him linger on with members of the Detroit District Dental Society.

Dr. Henry Green, society historian, has compiled a considerable amount of data concerning Dr. Spalding, Birmingham dentist who died recently at the age of 92.

Dr. Spalding had practiced here since 1924.

Dental society records showed that he played an active role in the organization's activities. He also pondered in periodontia, a disease of the teeth. Fellow-dentists chose him as the "outstanding Michigan dentist of 1955."

LOCAL DENTISTS have this to say of Dr. Spalding:

"Dr. Spalding was one of the most outstanding and beloved men in the community — outstanding both as a technician and a gentleman. If any of us was in trouble, he was always the first to give a lift with help and advice"—Dr. Edson K. Pool, 838 W. Glenayr.

"I was Dr. Spalding's personal dentist as well as being privileged to share his friendship. He was one of the most ingenious men who ever lived."

"Nowadays, dentists farm out work to technicians, but he didn't. He harked back to the days when dentists not only made their own porcelain jackets but the furnaces in which they were baked."

"He also designed many of his own instruments, some of which I'm using in my office today"—Dr. George E. Marin, 713 Pierce.

"I will never forget a dental meeting in Chicago where I asked Dr. Spalding why he was there—what could they possibly teach him. His reply was, 'Ed, I always consider any meeting a success' if I learn just one thing. Dr. Spalding was a great help to us young fellows"—Dr. Edwin W. Deer, 485 Ardmore.

DR SPALDING was born Sept. 18, 1868, at Eagle Harbor, Keweenaw county, and attended high school at Sault Ste. Marie. He attended Michigan Normal college and received his degree in dentistry from University of Michigan in 1892.

In 1910, he married Dr. Grace Rogers. Together, they developed a practice of specializing in periodontia. She died in 1953. Dr. and Mrs. Spalding left one daughter, Mrs. Barbara Ely, who lives on Commerce road.

Dental society records show that Dr. Spalding began in general practice, then specialized in periodontia and was among the first to do porcelain jacket work.

HE SERVED as secretary, vice president and president of the Michigan State Dental society and was a past president of the Academy of Periodontology; grand master, Delta Sigma Delta; fellow, American College of Dentists; charter member, Detroit Dental Clinic club; member, New York Institute of Stomatology; honorary member, Ohio State Dental society and Toledo Dental society; and a non-resident lecturer on porcelain crown work at U.M.

He also was a charter member and the last living charter member of the Detroit Golf club.

IN 1956 HE was active in the state dental association's centennial. He served as president of the Detroit District Dental Society in 1913-14.

Active in music circles, Dr. Spalding was one of the organizers of the Orpheus club, of which he served as a member for 21 years.

Yes, Dr. Spalding is gone now; but his achievements are on record with the Detroit District Dental society.
