B'ham Plan Board Adds Final Touch To Pool Ordinance
 The final touches were added to Birmingham's swimming pool ordinance by the planning board Tuesday night in preparation for its presentation to the city commission. A few last minute revisions received around city legal adviser Dean Beier's comments in letter form were accepted and two rejected by the board. Rewriting of the ordinance will delay presentation for approval until next Tuesday's joint meeting of the two bodies. AT THAT TIME the commission and board will also consider the Central Business District Development committee progress and the sale of Lakeside property north of Oak street. In other monthly business the board moved to recommend approval to the city commission of a new replat of Cornell Park submitted by the Branch corporation of Birmingham. Unlike previous proposals the board included proposals to either relocate Shirley drive or plan calls for the development of four parcels into seven parcels. ALTHOUGH FORMER plans submitted conformed to city ordinance requirements, they did not satisfy subdivision regulations.
