

Grant Registrations To 15 Men in Area

Fifteen area residents are among the 552 new registrations granted by the Michigan State Board of Registration for architects, professional engineers and land surveyors.

These newly-registered professional men have been granted the privilege of using the title of architect, professional engineer or registered land surveyor in their respective field.

In order to qualify for registration, the architect candidates were required to pass a 36-hour written examination and the engineer and land surveyor candidates a 18-hour written test.

IN ADDITION, all the candidates were required to have a minimum of eight years of qualifying experience and college credits in their respective field in order to write the examinations.

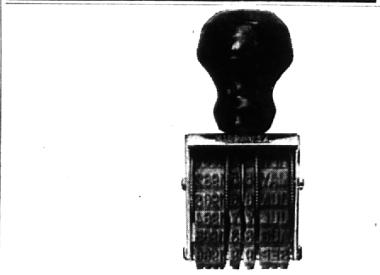
