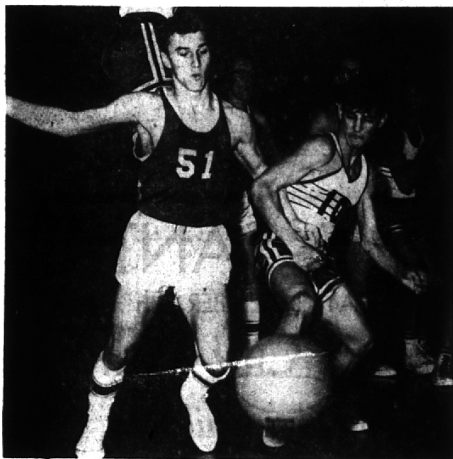

These shots taken at Bloomfield Hills' opening game against Oak Park show it doesn't take long for everybody to get into the basketball "swing," even after a long season of football.

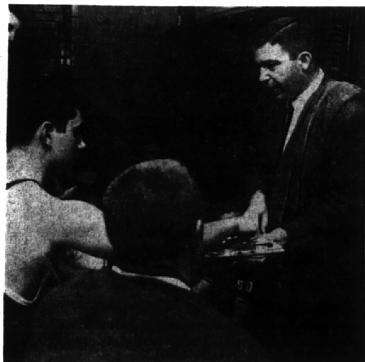
Probably the happiest person at the final buzzer—with the scoreboard showing the Hills' team the winner, 57-50—was their coach Ed Wichert.

It was his first game as the Barons' head man.

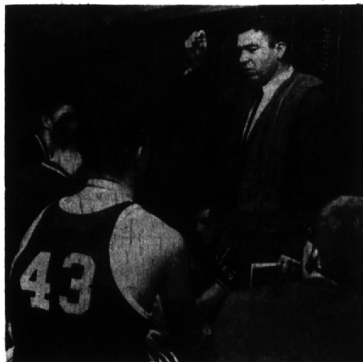

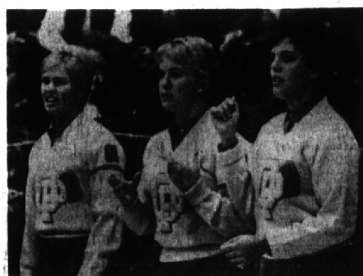
Hills' coach Wichert (left) is disgusted, happy. Losers' Paul Boyd seems worried, angry.



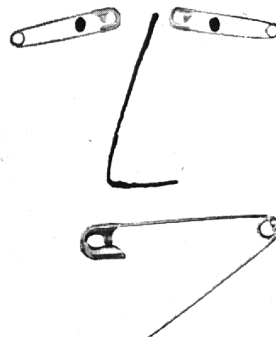
Locker room strategy: "Now get this play," says Wichert (left) . . . "and go out and beat 'em!"
