

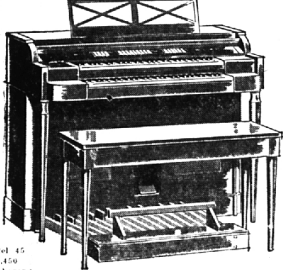

A novel feature of the afternoon's meeting will be the exchange of gift packages of traditional holiday goodies with family recipes.

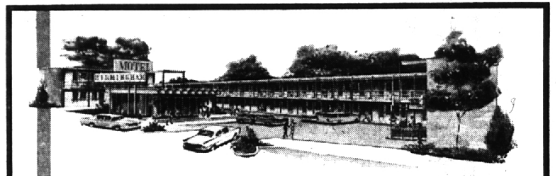

Association Elects Officers and Board At Annual Meeting

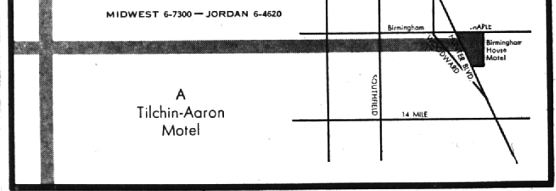
