May Move To Open Way For Boulevard

LATHRUP — Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley told the council Monday that they would ask the city to vacate an alley behind a 100 foot lot along Evergreen, between Sunnybrook and Saratoga. The Kelleys also plan to re-dedicate the 15 front feet along Evergreen road.

The two steps, if taken, will leave the way open for Evergreen to become a boulevard and sanitary sewer lines could be laid in the re-dedicated right-of-way.

City engineers, Ayres, Lewin, Norris and May have included plans to lay the lines either in the alley or in front.

SOUTHFIELD'S board of education recently decided an additional 27 feet of land, along 11 Mile road and on the south side of Ferry school, to the city of Southfield. The land is needed as part of the Evergreen boulevard development, between 11 1/2 and 12 Mile roads.

LATHRUP — Mayor Richard N. Cogger said Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Kelley made no offer comparable to a \$130,000 price for 13.8 acres of land that was optioned by the city last week. The Kelley's said the council met Saturday to discuss land acquisition for possible municipal and recreation use.

Council members had hoped the Kelleys who own most of the vacant property in Lathrup, might offer to sell some of their land to the city. Cogger said the city cannot delay buying land for city and recreational use because of land scarcity and rising costs. He said land inside the city would be preferable.

The optioned site adjoins Lathrup's western limit, north from Gale's 3 zone but water treatment plant. The option expires March 1, 1961.

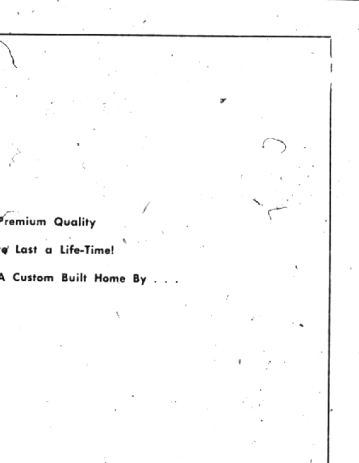


72nd Birthday

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Multiple Dwelling Ordinance Referred To Zoning Board

LATHRUP — The proposed multiple dwelling ordinance, amending zoning ordinance 18 (as amended), and including three petitions requesting specific areas to be zoned R-2, was referred by the council Monday night to the zoning board.

The resolution requested the board to hold a public hearing on the proposed zoning amendments and make a report and recommendation to the council.

A petition from Michael DiMatteo construction company, Lathrup, and Louise Lathrup Kelley asks for a zoning change for one block on 12 Mile, from R-1 (single residence) to TP-1 (transitional) zoning. The site are on 12 Mile, from the corner of Guy place eastward.

A SECOND petition from Sam S. Caradonna and Mrs. Kelly requested rezoning of one block from R-1 to R-2 (multiple dwelling district). The property is on 12 Mile road — the second block west of Southfield, from Guy Place to Bloomfield.

Another petition asked for rezoning of one block also from R-1 to R-2. The property is on 12 Mile, from Bloomfield to Santa Barbara. This petition was made by Mrs. Kelley.

Southfield Kennels Contribute Star Pupil

SOUTHFIELD — With a 14-week training phase completed, trooper Richard H. Abbott of the Erie post and his German shepherd police dog, Jocko, are expected to be on definite assignment with the Michigan State police out of East Lansing headquarters about the first of the year.

The four-and-a-half-year-old Jocko, whose name was changed from Dago von Liebestraum for command purposes, was a gift of Grant E. Mann, of the Liebestraum kennels in Southfield. The dog is all black, weighs 85 pounds and has the best of the Liebestraum stock.

JOCKO AND his trooper-handler have successfully completed a training course given at the St. Louis, Mo., police department canine training school. It is the beginning of a State police experiment to use trained dogs to track or trail lost persons or criminals.

Trooper Abbott says the training has made Jocko a good all-around police dog and, although he's already had extensive training, his schooling will be continued on a daily basis so that he remains alert and improves his skills.

Training phases included such activity as agility, searching buildings and boxes, open field search and tracking. Abbott and Jocko will be assigned to the headquarters training bureau.

THE DOG HAS become a member of the Abbott family, which includes Mrs. Abbott, two girls and a boy. Home treatment for the dog is recommended by canine school authorities. A station wagon has been outfitted as a traveling kennel.

Thoroughly trained to act on command, Jocko will do only two things on his own, says trooper Abbott. These are to protect himself and to protect his handler in event of physical attack. The dog is not vicious, takes to the training as a game, and is gentle with members of the Abbott family.

Plan Art Workshop Beginning Saturday

The art workshops on Saturday and on Dec. 17 will be devoted to Christmas decorations. Other plans will be announced for the workshop which will continue through January and February.

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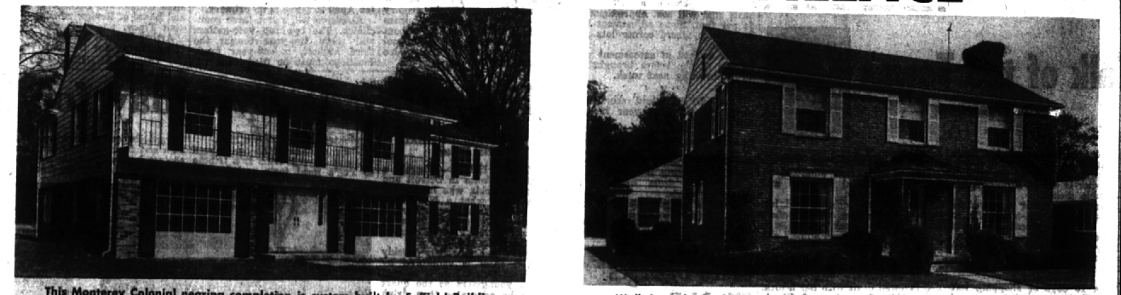
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
