### B'ham Commission OK's Replat of Coryell Park

Birmingham city commissioners tentatively approved Monday night a replat of four lots in the Coryell Park Subdivision.

Four lots on the west side of Shirley Drive, immediately south of Maple, will be cut into seven lots, each with approximately 145-foot frontage and 350-foot depth.

A previous proposal by the Branch Corp. to replat into 10 lots was denied by the Birmingham Planning Board and the commission.

Mrs. Earl Conlin, 488 Arlington, objected to the present proposal at Monday night's commission meeting, feeling that it would mar the beauty of Coryell Park.

HOWEVER, commissioners explained that since the project adhered to all city regulations, they must approve it.

Mrs. Conlin hinted at court proceedings but when asked later if she would seek an injunction against the corporation, she said she and two other women opposing the move "throw in the sponge."

"I don't like what is down there," she stated, but added that since the Branch Corp. had altered its plans after Coryell Park Subdivision residents protested its original proposals, she would acquiesce.

"IN ALL THE U.S. there is not a more beautiful residential area," Mrs. Conlin declared. "That little bit of beauty could be preserved if the majority of the people of Birmingham had a chance to express themselves."

She felt there should be lots for four houses instead of seven.

The old Coryell house still stands on one of the lots, but it will be completely remodeled.

Final approval of the replat will pend the planning board's written recommendations.
