The Troy High School Symphony Band will present its annual fall concert Tuesday at 8:00 p.m. in

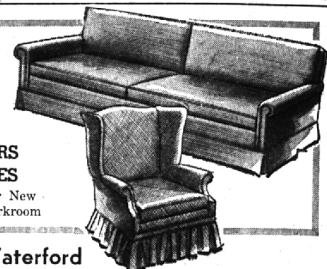
the auditorium. Featured on the kettledrum will be Eugene Rondeau, a graduate of Cass Technical High School. He also will do a solo with band accompaniment.

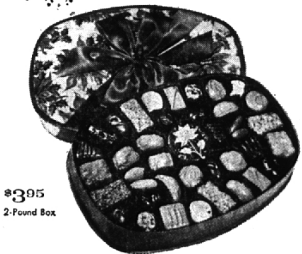

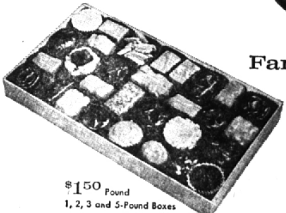
