

Franklin Council Revokes Permits, Finishes Agenda

FRANKLIN—Franklin's council welcomed a new member, revoked four building permits and completed the month's agenda Monday night.

Eugene Kelly, appointed to replace William Worcester who resigned last month, took the oath of office and agreed to serve as co-chairman of road matters with colleague William King.

THE COUNCIL took steps to enforce the zoning code by revoking building permits issued improperly to Daniel Lublin, Edward Klein and Sheldon Lublin for homes which are being constructed on unplatted property on Bruce Drive.

THE BUILDERS are charged with changing plans and specifications of the four houses under construction without securing village approval. They are also cited for violation of Ordinance 11 by not complying with regulations on lot lines and area requirements.

SOUTHFIELD—No action was taken at Monday's Board of Education meeting on the request of Bonnie Acres Improvement Association, asking the school district to share the cost of paving Glasgow and San Rosa Sts.

Board members said they were sympathetic to the request but could not use bond money for this purpose, according to advice from school attorneys.

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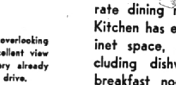
