LATHRUP — The winter newsletter, published by the city, lists a number of recreation activities open to local residents.

Persons interested in registering for adult ballroom dancing lessons, and the adult Latin rhythm dance class are urged to do so immediately.

Sewer Connection Bids Tossed Out By S'field B of E

SOUTHFIELD — Bids for sewer connections at Brace school for the Evergreen interceptor were opened and rejected Monday by the Southfield Board of Education.

Bidders, however, were invited to submit another bid on new specifications to be provided by the engineer, William Dolgner of Dolgner, Rolinson and Rokicki, architects and engineers.

Original plans and specifications, on which the bids were based, must be altered to conform with Oakland County DPW requirements. The DPW said quicksand in the area may lead to trouble with existing manholes and wants three man-

holes installed and the sewer lines re-routed.

DOLGNER SAID Southfield City Administrator Robert McNutt had approved new specifications.

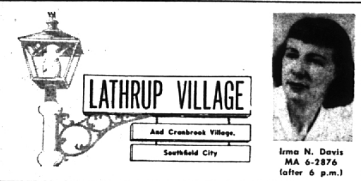
Low bid Monday was \$2,985. Bids ranged from that figure to a high of \$16,025.
