# Birmingham - Bloomfield Hills Society Notes

## Chief Kickapoo, go home.

Our history lesson for today concerns your reader who saw the Shirley Temple show last week. The story told of a nine year old girl, Debbie Debbie, who was speaking, Detroit) who was captured by the Senecas, held captive and adopted by their chief, Cornplanter.

We talked to Mrs. W. B. Woodburn of W. Lincoln who is the niece of this very same little Debbie who was captured in 1779.

MRS. WOODBURN'S granddaughter, eight year old Debbie Woodburn, was named after her famous forebear and attends school at Holy Name.

Grandma Woodburn has documents and letters of the story which have been used by the historical museum, and says the television adaptation of the story, which was released by the chief Cornplanter until after the end of the Indian war, was untrue when returned to her home by the Indian agent, and lost her Indian ways very slowly.

History believes that the chief of the Seneca's (Iroquoian nation) adopted Debbie because he himself had one white parent. Chief Cornplanter was also a good friend of George Washington's (a good friend to have in those days I imagine).

AFTER HER return, Debbie grew up in what is now Groesse Pointe, married and moved to Fort Dearborn where her husband had a trading post. During the Indian Massacre there Debbie and her family were spared because of her earlier connections with the Senecas and Chief Cornplanter.

And that's our lesson from the correspondence school today.

# B'ham School Head Attends Conference

Daniel A. Nesbitt, curriculum director of Birmingham Public Schools, is attending the Regional Orientation Conference in Mathematics in Cincinnati, Ohio, this week.

The conference is the last one of eight held throughout the United States this year. Sponsored by the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, it is designed to help school systems strengthen their mathematics programs thru the use of the new materials of instruction.

The project, supported by a \$48,000 grant from the National Science Foundation, is aimed at providing supervisors and school administrators with the latest information available.

THE TWO-DAY conference consists of a four-part program including "Progress in Mathematics and Its Implication for the Secondary School," "The Drive to Improve School Mathematics - Comparisons and Common Elements of Special Programs," "Our Experience with the New Programs in Mathematics," and "Implementing the New Mathematics Program in Your School."
