**Gov.-Elect Endorses Romney Proposal**

The 18 Michigan organizations actively campaigning for a constitutional convention have unanimously recommended appointment of a "truly bipartisan" gubernatorial commission to help the legislature prepare for the vote on the convention question at the 1961 Spring election.

The recommendation, endorsing a proposal made independently last month by George Romney, governor-elect, was contained in a letter released by Gov.-elect John B. Swainson from the Coordinating Committee for Constitutional Convention, representing the sixteen organizations. It was signed by Romney in his capacity as chairman of the committee.

Among the 18 organizations represented by the American Association of University Women, Bagwell Boosters Club, Methodist Board of Christian Social Relations, Oakland Co. Citizens League, United Church Women of Michigan and Wayne-Oakland-Macomb Co. Building Trades Council.
