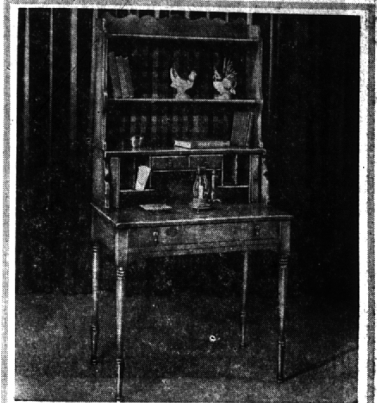
Now for "putting Christ back into Christmas." Our churches these weeks have been singing of "The Messiah" to standing room only.
